Program Highlights



City of Capitola – SB 1383 Compliance Services

Since 2023, El has led Capitola's SB 1383 compliance efforts for both organics diversion and edible food recovery. We worked with City staff and the hauler to ensure all generators were enrolled in organics collection, using contamination reports to target outreach, provide on-site training, and implement progressive enforcement including violation follow-ups and auto-enrollment. For edible food recovery, El conducted capacity building and direct outreach to Tier 1 and Tier 2 generators. We partnered with City staff to maintain public-facing information on food donation requirements and recovery organizations, and participated in County capacity planning. El provides ongoing education about surplus food donation requirements and facilitates agreements between generators and recovery organizations. We also maintain detailed implementation records and prepare Capitola's Electronic Annual Report (EAR) to CalRecycle, ensuring compliance with all SB 1383 regulatory requirements.



City of Marina – Organics and Compliance Program

El supports the City of Marina with business organics diversion and public education. Our services included auditing the generator lists, processing waivers, and creating customized compliance documentation, such as certification forms for businesses with alternative disposal methods. To drive compliance, we implemented a direct outreach with "Notice of Non-Compliance" letters, followed by one-on-one technical assistance for businesses needing additional support. We also enhanced public engagement by maintaining an FAQ section on the City's website, posting monthly social media content, and producing educational flyers. El continues to assist Marina in regional SB 1383 planning efforts with local JPA partners.



City of Scotts Valley – Business Inspections and Edible Food Recovery

El integrates SB 1383 compliance services into our long-standing source control education and inspections programs for Scotts Valley. We conduct over 100 annual business inspections for AB 341 commercial recycling and 75 inspections for SB 1383 organics compliance, targeting businesses identified through waste hauler data. Our process includes notification letters, facility walkthroughs to assess organics generation, and follow-up consultation on appropriate bin sizes and Best Management Practices. We deliver staff training on strategic bin placement, educational signage, and proper organics diversion. We also manage waiver processing and prepare the City's Electronic Annual Report to CalRecycle. For edible food recovery, we support Santa Cruz County efforts by educating Tier 1 and Tier 2 generators, facilitating recovery agreements, and ensuring compliance tracking.



San Mateo County - Countywide Edible Food Recovery Outreach

El is leading countywide SB 1383 outreach and survey effort to hundreds of Tier 1 and Tier 2 edible food generators across San Mateo County's 20 cities and unincorporated areas. The survey project is collecting data on self- reported compliance status and current donation practices, which will inform strategic compliance inspections and enforcement actions by the County.

In addition to assessing compliance readiness, EI is providing as-needed technical assistance to generators to help them assess and track surplus edible food, identify relevant recovery organizations, and establish recovery agreements and reporting procedures to ensure SB 1383 compliance.
